Damocles – Dam-oh-kleez

defendo, defendere, defendi, defensum – defend, protect

Dionysius – Die-oh-ny-sis (*King of the Syracusans*)

exclamo, exclamare, exclamavi, exclamatum – exclaim, shout out

fortiter – bravely

invito, invitare, invitavi, invitatum – invite

offer, offere, obtuli, oblatum – offer

omnia – everything

optimus, optima, optimum – very good, excellent, best

purpureus, purpurea, purpureum – purple

suavis, suave – sweet
